LOCAL RESIDENT SELECTED FOR HONOR FLIGHT

Clyde Briggs, long-time resident of Arrowhead Estates and WW II Veteran, has been selected to be on the Honor Flight to Washington, DC. to visit the WW II Wall of Honor departing Oklahoma on September 10th. He was selected for this Honor Flight by the Kilihoti Chapter of the DAR, of which Mrs. Tammy Hinton is the Regent.

Sergeant Briggs enlisted in the US Army in July of 1944 in California and was subsequently transferred to Fort Benning, Georgia for parachute school. He was then assigned to the Military Police Platoon of the 13th Airborne Division. He spent most of his military career in and around France.

He was awarded the Army Good Conduct Medal, WW II Victory Medal, American Campaign Medal, European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal with 2 Battle Stars for the Rhineland and Central Europe Campaigns, Belgium Order of the Crown and the French Croix de Guerre.

Clyde will be accompanied by John Elrod, also an Arrowhead Estates resident, fellow Mason and retired military.

He will quickly tell you he is a proud 92 years of age and even though some things may be slowing him down, his mind is sharp as a tack. Anyone who knows him is well aware of the truth in that statement. We know that he is looking forward to this trip and wish him well.
